Our first holiday this month is May 5th which is Cinco De Mayo. Cinco De Mayo is a yearly celebration held on May 5, which commemorates the anniversary of Mexico's victory over the Second French Empire at the Battle of Puebla in 1862, led by General Ignacio Zaragoza. The victory over the French army was a morale boost for the Mexicans. Zaragoza died months after the battle from an illness, and a larger French force ultimately defeated the Mexican army at a Second Battle of Puebla and occupied Mexico City. However, this was not the end of the war and when the American civil war ended the Union started loaning money and guns to Mexican liberals, pushing France and Mexican Conservatives to the edge of defeat. At the opening of the French chambers in January 1866, Napoleon III announced that he would withdraw French troops from Mexico.

May 14th is Mother's Day this year. A day for us all to show great gratitude to the women in our lives that are mothers. So, make sure you treat your wife kindly that day, and don't forget to call your mother!

Last but not least, Memorial Day! May 29th is Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America. It's difficult to prove the origins of this day as over two dozen towns and cities lay claim to be the birthplace. In May 1966, President Lyndon Johnson stepped in and officially declared Waterloo N.Y. the birthplace of Memorial Day. Regardless of the location of origins or the exact date, one thing is crystal clear – Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War (which ended in 1865) and a desire to honor our dead. On the 5th of May in 1868, General John Logan who was the national commander of the Grand Army of the republic, officially proclaimed it in his General Order No. 11.

May we all forever remember the men and women who fought and died defending this Great nation. Thank you for your great courage and honor. As for the men and women serving today in the United States military. Thank you too for your service, your honor, and your courage.

From the West



Chico Masonic Family Center Board of Directors

Crown Castle, the company that manages the cellular tower behind the lodge, is adding a backup generator and new phone equipment for Verizon phone company. They will be paying the Chico Masonic Family Center an additional \$547.50 per month. This is in addition to the monthly fee we receive.

Potholes at storm drains in front of and behind the lodge have been temporarily filled with road base until they can be patched properly. The traffic cones have been removed.

The storm drain shafts have filled with dirt over time. It appears that when installed, the holes to hook and hoist the concrete shafts were not sealed and over the decades dirt was pushed through those holes by gophers or ground squirrels. The holes will be sealed and a vacuum truck will be needed to clean out the dirt. A two-foot concrete apron around the drain should be created to replace the asphalt to prevent soil erosion.


What do you do for a living? I've been a music teacher for the past 20 years, more less right out of high school. Currently I am

More Light From The East:

The Kybalion, a book on Hermetic Philosophy

It was published by the Yogi Publication Society in 1908. There are seven seed truths contained in The Kybalion, and these principles explain what Hermetists describe as the art of Mental Transmutation. This may sound like magic, but the hermetic teachings in The Kybalion are actually scientific. Most people don't realize that a set of Universal Laws that apply to all created things even exists. That is what hermetic philosophy is: an explanation of the universal, fundamental principles that determine how reality works. By adopting and mastering these Kybalion principles, you can tap into the divine power of the universe. Only those who are ready for the wisdom conveyed in the book ever even discover it.

Key Principles of *The Kybalion:*

There are axioms that the Three Initiates spread throughout the Kybalion. Each one provides you with a nugget of wisdom that illuminates one of the Hermetic principles. Every one of the proverbs of Hermetic Philosophy sheds more light on the topic. They help the student of The Kybalion to understand and apply the meaning of the Hermetic laws they relate to. Here's a sample of some of them:

- THE ALL IS MIND;
- o the Universe is Mental
- As above, so below,
- o as below, so above
- Nothing rests;
- o everything moves;
- o everything vibrates
- Everything is Dual;
- o everything has poles;
- o everything has its pair of opposites;
- o like and unlike are the same;
- o opposites are identical in nature, but different in degree;
- o extremes meet;
- o all truths are but half truths;
- o all paradoxes can be reconciled
- Everything flows, out and in;
- o everything has its tides;
- o all things rise and fall;
- o the pendulum-swing manifests in everything:
- o the measure of the swing to the right is the measure of the swing to the left;
- rhythm compensates
- Every Cause has its Effect;
- every Effect has its Cause;
- o everything happens according to Law;
- o Chance is but a name for Law not recognized;
- o there are many planes of causation, but nothing escapes the Law
- Gender is in everything;
- o everything has its Masculine and Feminine Principles;
- o gender manifests on all planes

It's an incredible book on the Hermetic principles discussed in Hermes Trismegistus' book "The Corpus Hermetica". Hermetics is at the core of freemasonry. I would encourage all to read this book as it has great knowledge and it's a pretty short read.
